Just like at home, the most used rooms in the house often need the most TLC; the same goes for our District's facilities. It's time for upgrades and replacing some of our worn-out amenities. Of course, the key is keeping costs to a minimum while maximizing our energy efficiency across campus. This spring and summer's "to do" list includes phasing in LED lighting upgrades, replacing windows on the west facing MS

and HS buildings, repairing and resurfacing our all-weather track, and laying the ground work for renovating the HS weight room and locker rooms. We have been diligently planning for these projects by putting money aside into our capital improvement fund and seeking the best low-cost options available. The new lighting includes dimmable LED panels in classrooms which will make viewing of computer and overhead screens much more conducive to student learning. Replacing decades-old, leaking windows with energy-efficient models will save on heating and cooling costs. Our all-weather track turns 12 years old this summer. It was due for resurfacing three years ago, but do to exceptional care, it has surpassed its life expectancy; however, we can no longer ignore its condition. In addition, next spring EHS will host the NWOAL League Track Meet, which places its need at the top of the list. Finally, we have outgrown our current locker and weight rooms and accommodating visiting athletic teams has become nearly impossible. Just like at home, projects abound, but we eagerly anticipate better accommodations to serve our students. Wishing you all a warm spring and short "to do" lists!

EHS WEIGHT ROOM OPEN TO PUBLIC

Check out EHS's weight room: it's free, supervised, and open to community members three days a week. Located inside the high school, next to the athletic director's office and boys locker room (use the exterior athletic entrance), the weight room is full of equipment as well as stationary bikes and free weights. Joe Blystone, certified personal trainer, is on-site and available to help you meet your needs. EXPERIENCES BRIDGE GAPS -

When EHS's senior English class was assigned to read the Vietnam War narrative, *The Things They Carried* by Tim O'Brien, teacher Brittney Cymbolin reached out to military combat survivors to share their experiences with her class. According to Cymbolin, there are some things in school a student can not learn from a textbook; true life experiences often serve as our best teachers. The narrative discusses a combat soldier's life before, during, and after the war. To help answer student questions, Larry Dunbar, long-time Evergreen community member, and Josh Martin, EHS intervention specialist, volunteered their time to talk to the students about their real-life experiences as combat veterans. Dunbar was drafted in 1966 and served two tours during the Vietnam War. Martin was part of the 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, Kilo Company from 1999-2004 and one of the first Marine Corps units to enter Baghdad, Iraq. "A special thank you to these two men not only for their service, but for helping bridge the gap between words on a page and real-life events so our students can better understand events that have shaped their world," said Cymbolin.

REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS -

Ohio Law requires students entering kindergarten, seventh grade, and twelfth grade to have certain vaccines/immunizations before school begins in August.

- Kindergarteners must have a complete set of immunizations. A copy of your child's completed immunization card must be submitted to Evergreen Elementary as soon as possible.
- Seventh grade students must be vaccinated against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis. Since most children received their last dose of this vaccine when they entered kindergarten, most will need a booster at this time. Ohio Law also requires a vaccine to prevent meningitis. Both of these requirements *must* be completed before school starts this fall.
- Twelfth grade students must be vaccinated against meningitis according to Ohio Law. If your teen has already received the MCV4 meningococcal vaccine and it was given after their 16th birthday, another vaccine is not necessary, but a copy of the shot record must be forwarded to EHS. A dose prior to seventh grade does not meet this requirement, and an additional dose is needed prior to the start of 12th grade. Other recommended immunizations for this age group include Hepatitis A and HPV vaccines.

These vaccines/immunizations may be given by your child's doctor if he/she administers this service. The Fulton County Health Department will be offering special "School Shot" clinics by appointment. Cost depends on the type of vaccine administered and insurance coverage. The Health Department is contracted with many insurance plans and has vaccines available for children without insurance. Please call the Fulton County Health Department at 419-337-0915 for an appointment.

Vaccines can also be obtained at regular immunization clinics at the Health Department as posted on their website: www.fultoncountyhealthdept.com. All clinics are by appointment only. A parent or guardian must accompany the student to the clinic or sign an "Immunization Consent Form," which can be downloaded from the Health Department website, to permit another responsible adult to immunize the child on your behalf. You must take your child's immunization record (from your doctor's office) with you, or you may be refused services. If you have any questions about childhood immunizations, please phone your family physician or contact the Fulton County Health Department at 419-337-0915.

TRANSPORTATION FORMS DUE -

Parents are required every year to submit a new Transportation Enrollment Form for every student riding an Evergreen school bus to/from school. Forms, as well as procedures and guidelines, are now available on the Evergreen website under the "Transportation" link. Completed forms are due by July 1 and can be returned to your child's building before the last day of school, May 23. Forms may be faxed to 419-644-6070, or emailed to CBrown@evgvikings.org. Also, if at anytime there is a change in your child's transportation needs, fill out the Change Form so accommodations can be made as soon as possible. SOS TUTORING A SUCCESS.

Evergreen Local Schools is proud to participate in the Students for Other Students (SOS) tutoring program. According to Kristin Carrisalez, Evergreen elementary teacher and program coordinator, SOS pairs students in grades three through eight with high school student tutors to work on lesson reviews, assignments, and homework after school twice a week. Tutoring sessions officially began in February; however, high schoolers began the application and interview process just before the holidays.

There are currently 15 high school tutors working with 30 students. The tutors and students are paired based upon the high schooler's academic strengths. Tutoring sessions are supervised by Carrisalez and take place after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00-4:00 pm in the elementary building. Bus transportation to students' homes is provided. The tutoring service is offered to students by teacher recommendation. Funding for the program has been provided by an anonymous donor and pays for tutor wages, snacks, and transportation.

"The SOS tutoring program has shown great success in a short amount of time," said Carrisalez. "The elementary teachers have already seen an increase in their student's confidence levels, more homework is being turned in on time, and students are more engaged in the classroom. Parents are happy, and students are on track and enjoy one-on-one time with the high schoolers. We are seeing great results, and we plan to continue the program into the future," she added. Any parent who thinks their child would benefit from the SOS tutoring program should talk to their child's homeroom teacher.
