IS THE NWOAL THE RIGHT ATHLETIC LEAGUE FOR EVERGREEN?

Evergreen Local School administrators are exploring options outside the Northwest Ohio Athletic League (NWOAL). Why? The simple answer is to allow for more evenly matched competition as well as for the safety for our athletes. The longer answer includes three main reasons why this move is under consideration: history, student athlete success, and league movement.

Ongoing communications and future meetings will take place before a final recommendation is made to the Evergreen Board of Education whether or not to remain in the NWOAL. The following information was presented to the Board of Education at the March 22 meeting. The accumulated data illustrates Evergreen's history in the NWOAL for the past 45 years. The public is invited to a Community Forum scheduled on March 29 as the District continues to evaluate what is in the best interest of its student athletes. The goal is to create the most successful athletic program possible for the Vikings.

HISTORY

- The NWOAL was established in1926 and originally included Bryan, Delta, Liberty Center, Montpelier, Napoleon, and Wauseon. Sports included football, boys basketball, and track.
- Evergreen joined the NWOAL in 1969 while dually joining the Northern Border League (NBL).
- Evergreen left the NWOAL in 1971 to solely compete in the NBL with smaller schools, including Delta, Patrick Henry, and Swanton, to remain competitive.
- When the NBL dissolved in 1978, Evergreen was absorbed back into the NWOAL along with Delta and Swanton.
- When competing for league titles, Evergreen is historically on the bottom of the NWOAL while Archbold, Bryan, and Wauseon have been consistently the top three schools.
- In the 45 years Evergreen has been an NWOAL member, the Vikings have only clinched 3.6% of the NWOAL 1st Place titles.

STUDENT ATHLETE SUCCESS

- Evergreen has the fewest NWOAL championships among all the schools; we currently have a tradition of not being competitive.
- The goal entering every league contest should be to have at least a 50% chance of success.
- Winning more games and titles will breed a winning attitude throughout the district while increasing student and spectator participation in Evergreen athletics.
- Being more competitive will instill Viking pride among our athletes, student body, and community. Creating a more competitive and winning culture will help to ensure student athlete success into the future.
- Building winning traditions will help create a more positive climate throughout the district.
- If a league change occurs, the opportunity for Evergreen to play its neighboring districts and honor its long-standing rivalries will still exist through non-league contests.

LEAGUE MOVEMENT

- Membership changes in the Toledo Area Athletic Conference (TACC), Northern Lakes League (NLL), Buckeye Border Conference (BBC), Three Rivers Athletic Conference (TRACC), and the Green Meadows Conference (GMAC) will have a significant impact on the membership of the NWOAL.
- Swanton's administration is asking its BOE to approve a resolution to leave the NWOAL and form a new league, thus creating an opening in the NWOAL.
- Napoleon and other NLL schools (much larger than Evergreen) have already expressed interest in joining the NWOAL.
- Leaving the NWOAL proactively may be Evergreen's best chance at controlling its own destiny. In order to provide Viking athletes true competitiveness, Evergreen would be best served competing against comparable-sized schools with equivalent athletic programs.


POSSIBLE NEW LEAGUE


