







DISTRICT SERVICE AWARDS



EHS LOCKER ROOM RENOVATION & EXPANSION -

The EHS locker room and renovation expansion is back on. Curtailed a year ago due to the uncertainty associated with the COVID pandemic, the project is set to begin this summer. In addition to expanded locker rooms, the project includes room for cardio and weight equipment as well as areas for training and rehabilitating injured athletes, extra classroom space that can double as a team meeting room, and increased storage. According to Eric Smola, superintendent, this project will enable Evergreen to provide equal facilities for both male and female athletes, a need that has gone unfulfilled for far too long.



IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED FOR 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

Ohio law requires students entering kindergarten, 7th grade, and 12th grade to have certain vaccines/immunizations before school begins in August.

- Kindergarteners must have a complete set of immunizations on file at EES.
- Incoming 7th graders must be vaccinated against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Tdap). Since most children received their last vaccine dose when they entered kindergarten, a booster will be needed before school resumes this fall. Ohio law also requires a vaccine to prevent meningitis, and children have not previously had this vaccination. Both requirements must be completed before school starts in August.
- Incoming 12th graders must be vaccinated against meningitis. If your teen has already received the MCV4 meningococcal vaccine and it was given after their 16th birthday, another vaccine is not necessary. Please provide a copy of the vaccination record to the school. A dose prior to 7th grade does not meet the requirement and an additional dose is needed prior to beginning 12th grade this fall.
- While a COVID vaccine is not required to attend school, it is recommended students 12 years and older receive it prior to school starting in August.


