

MR. LYONS IS THE BEST!



Mr. Chris Lyons, Evergreen High and Middle School band instructor, has been named the American Legion Department of Ohio's 2022 Educator of the Year. An Evergreen teacher for 31 years, Mr. Lyons was initially nominated by his peers and then selected by Evergreen's administration to be endorsed by the local American Legion Post 373 in Delta, Ohio. His nomination progressed through the county, district and state levels where he was selected as the best teacher in Ohio in 2022. He was. presented with the award in late January 2023 in Columbus.

"Chris's charismatic personality attracts students to the band and his skill as an educator turns them into musicians. No one is more deserving of this honor than Mr. Lyons," said Eric Smola, superintendent.

Under the direction of Mr. Lyons, the EHS Band has expanded from 13 members in 1991 to a membership of 160 students. The number of students enrolled in the EHS Band encompasses over 40 percent of the school's entire enrollment. The EHS Band consistently earns Superior awards at Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) Large Group Contests and actively performs throughout the region at numerous parades and festivals. The band has also performed in Washington D.C., Boston, and Walt Disney World. In 2001, the Evergreen Band performed at the Liberty Bowl Halftime and earned first place honors in the Liberty Bowl Parade.

Mr. Lyons has been selected as the recipient of the Franklin B. Walter "Teacher Who Makes a Difference" award eight times throughout his career. He is a Jennings Scholar and was selected as the *Toledo Blade's* Teacher-of-the-Month in November 2005 and March 2014. In addition, Evergreen has selected him as the school's Outstanding Edu-

cator for 2005-06, 2011-12, and 2021-22. In 2018, he was inducted into the Roy C. Start High School Hall of Fame. Mr. Lyons is in demand locally as a clinician, leadership conference speaker, and guest conductor for numerous Honor Bands.

It's hard to believe the school year is more than half over. So far, it has been filled with many positive factors, including an increase in school spirit, elevated building atmospheres, and an overall sense of heightened energy. This enthusiasm is creating outstanding learning experiences for our students.

In November, the Evergreen Board of Education approved the District's updated Strategic Plan, titled *The Viking Compass*, to serve as the District's directional framework through 2025. Like other organizations, we used the strategic planning process to reflect upon our progress, gather feedback, review our core values and mission, and establish goals for the next several years. Our strategic plan clearly identifies what Evergreen Local Schools value most and what the District stands for as an educational institution. Our goals are to increase student opportunities, improve student preparedness for the future, and to improve the overall student experience while at Evergreen. We are committed to continue building upon Evergreen's rich traditions while ensuring our place as one of Ohio's most excellent school systems.

Also in November, Evergreen had a .25% renewal operating levy on the ballot. These funds are used to pay teacher and staff salaries, building utilities, and instructional resources and curriculum. It passed by 306 votes. Thank you! Community support is critical to our ongoing operations of the District. We can't do it without you.

Congratulations to our boys soccer team who was named back-to-back Sectional Champs this fall! Also, congratulations to our faculty members who have been recognized for their outstanding career accomplishments.

GRIEF-SENSITIVE DESIGNATION-

Evergreen Local Schools has been designated a "Grief-Sensitive School" by the New York Life Foundation. As a result, Evergreen has been awarded a \$500 grant to help create a bereavement support plan while encouraging ongoing staff development as part of the national Grief-Sensitive Schools Initiative. The initiative is a pioneering effort to better equip educators to care for grieving students in their schools while gaining a better understanding of grief's impact among school-age children.



STEM GRANT RECIPIENT -

Evergreen has been awarded \$5,000 to expand its STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) learning projects through the Ohio STEM Learning Network (OSLN) Classroom Grant Program, funded by Battelle. Evergreen is one of 164 public schools in Ohio to be awarded this grant. According to Dr. Dolores Swineford, assistant superintendent and curriculum director, the grant will be used to purchase additional classroom resources and supplies to foster creative learning and problem solving skills across multiple grade levels.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION -

Kindergarten registration for the 2023-2024 school year opens February 6. To begin the process, a parent must access FinalForms on the Evergreen website at *evgvikings.org*. Once the online registration is complete and submitted, a screening appointment will be confirmed. Screenings will take place April 11, 12, and 13.

HONORED VIKINGS



Kelsey Ford, EES 5th grade teacher, was recognized this fall as a distinguished graduate of Trine University and honored with an alumni award during its annual Touchstone and Homecoming celebration. Ms. Ford received the Outstanding Young Alumni Award for being an accomplished professional and role model in her career, as a community activist, and as an active supporter of Trine University.



Jerry Keifer, EHS teacher and varsity boys basketball coach, was recognized this fall as a Defiance Alumni "Coach of the Year" for his outstanding 2019-2020 boys basketball season. The Vikings were named NWOAL Champs and Sectional/District Champs. Their Regional contest was canceled due to the COVID pandemic. This is Mr. Keifer's third time being honored by Defiance College. In addition, Mr. Keifer celebrated his 400th career win after the victory against North Central on November 29. Mr. Keifer's 400 wins have all been attained during his tenure at Evergreen while coaching the Viking boys basketball team.



STUDENT SAFETY-

According to Eric Smola, superintendent, one of the greatest fears school personnel face today is a threat to student safety. As swatting events are becoming more common in northwest Ohio and around the country, District leaders have never been more vigilant and concerned with student safety. Swatting is the action of making a prank call to emergency services in an attempt to dispatch a large number of armed police officers to a particular address. While Evergreen Local Schools hopes to never experience a real or fabricated threat, the District must be prepared for this possibility.

In addition to having a full-time School Resource Officer (SRO) on campus daily, the District has formed a Threat Assessment Team comprised of administrators, a mental health specialist, special education professional, and the school's SRO who is also a Fulton County Deputy. The team is designed to address all types of safety concerns and how to keep the students as safe as possible. In December, the team participated in Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Training. Additional training will take place in February when team members will focus on crisis management for rural-based incidents with law enforcement and first responders.

"Unfortunately, the need to be prepared is greater than ever, and the District continues to take the necessary steps to ensure student and staff safety," said Mr. Smola.




