

3 CANDIDATES COMPETE FOR 2 BOE SEATS

In November, voters will elect two individuals to serve as members of the Evergreen Board of Education (BOE). There are three candidates running for two seats. The incumbents seeking re-election are Nora Kiefer (two terms served) and Zach Murry (one term served). Rusty Carr is the new candidate. The term of office is four years and will begin January 1, 2024. According to the Ohio School Boards Association (OSBA), the role of a school board is to act as the governance team for the school district and to serve as a positive and responsible liaison between the school district and community.

RENEWAL LEVY ON THE NOV. BALLOT-

The Evergreen Local Board of Education has placed a 0.5% levy renewal on the upcoming November 7, 2023 ballot. This levy will expire on December 31, 2024 and accounts for approximately \$1.4 million of the District's General Fund. If passed, it will take effect on January 1, 2025 and it will run for five years, expiring at the end of December 2029. This is not a new tax. If the levy does not pass, it will return on the May 2024 ballot.

Schools are funded by the State of Ohio through the Ohio Department of Education, local property taxes, and a local income tax established by a traditional tax base. Evergreen Local Schools is currently funded by three income tax levies that when combined totals 1.5%. The levy breakdown includes:

- Levy 1 = 0.75% continuing
- Levy 2 = 0.25% renewed November 2022, continues through December 2027
- Levy 3 = 0.50% expires on December 31, 2024


As already stated, this levy is responsible for approximately \$1,400,000.00 of the District's General Fund. This fund is used to pay for Evergreen's day-to-day expenses, including: special education services, curriculum resources/textbooks, student programs, teachers and staff salaries, building utilities, transportation, and supplies. Evergreen's largest expenditure is personnel costs followed by operating expenses. This renewal tax does not tax social security income.

The General Fund does not pay for food services, athletics, debt services, permanent improvement projects, or student scholarships; these areas have separate funds and separate sources of revenue that cannot be combined.

USDA ACTION TO

GRANT RECIPIENT

Evergreen Local Schools is excited to announce it has recently been awarded a \$146,770.00 Healthy Meals Incentives Grant for small or rural food authorities. Evergreen is one of 264 school districts across 44 states and one of 12 school districts in Ohio to receive this award. The funding for this grant is provided by the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service.



"Students in every community deserve access to healthy and nutritious meals," said USDA Deputy Secretary Xochitl Torres Small. "With these funds, school districts will be able to provide more nutritious meals which will help students succeed in the classroom and beyond," she added.

What experiences or skills have prepared you to serve as a BOE member? I have worked in customer service for 21 years with the same employer. I have coached many different youth sports which has given me the chance to interact with Evergreen families often. I have worked for the school system as a boys basketball bookkeeper for over 25 years. In addition, I was vice-president of the Evergreen Youth Association (EYA) and a board member of the Chris Miller Evergreen Athletic Boosters Golf Outing in which I was in charge of going to businesses getting donations and talking to business owners.

NEW SAFETY UPGRADES -

Over the summer, new safety upgrades were installed across Evergreen's campus in order to strengthen campus security for students, staff, and visitors. These improvements were made possible through various grants.

Building Entry - Raptor

Part of keeping students and staff safe is knowing who is in the buildings at all times. Raptor has been installed in all three buildings which screens visitors, contractors, and volunteers as they enter the main doors. Visitors must present their driver's license to be scanned into Raptor which searches for comparisons with a national registered sex offender database. Once entry is approved, a badge is issued that identifies the visitor, the date, and the purpose of the visit.

Vape Detectors - HALO Sensors

All student restrooms and locker rooms in both the high school and middle school have been fitted with vape detectors known as HALO sensors. Utilizing the latest in smart technology, HALO adds a layer of security in places not covered by traditional surveillance cameras in unsupervised areas. HALO sensors detect environmental changes produced by vape and vape with THC. When substances are detected, violators will be dealt with accordingly.


911 Inform

911 Inform is a notification and emergency management program that provides school officials and emergency responders with state-of-the-art tools to effectively address any crisis situation that may arise anywhere on the Evergreen campus. The system saves valuable response time while allowing the administration to instantly know the who, what, where, and when of any emergency. Evergreen Local Schools is the first school in northwest Ohio to implement this mass communication system.

STATE REPORT CARD



The Ohio Department of Education recently released the local report cards for both schools and districts. Ratings of 1 to 5 starts, in half-star increments, were awarded based on the following components: Overall, Achievement, Progress, Early Literacy, Gap Closing and Graduation.

Evergreen Local Schools received an overall rating of 4 stars. EES received 4.5 stars. EMS received 3.5 stars. EHS received 4.5 stars.

According to Dr. Dolores Swineford, assistant superintendent and curriculum director, "It is important to remember that the local report cards are only one part of our District's educational journey. It does not reflect the hard work and progress taking place daily in our buildings."

Based on the data, the following strengths and areas of concerns have been identified. Evergreen will focus on student supports to address the areas of concern.

- Progress and Gap Closing components improved
- Gifted indicator points increased

CONCERNS

- Decrease shown in Early Literacy component
- Chronic absenteeism increased
- Four & five-year graduation rates decreased

ACTION STEPS

- Implementation of Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)
- Professional Development focusing on student supports
- New math curriculum purchased for grades K-12
